Even with the occasional unruly guest, Culpepper is still proud of the work The Well does. And he hopes that the community will continue to support the effort in the future.

"Our biggest need continues to be volunteers and our second big gest need is financial assistance. It costs us about \$150,000 to operate The Well. We appreciate financial gifts and in kind donations socks, underwear, paper goods.



# Our Ministries

FaithWorks serves the needs of more than 20,000 people annually in the Golden Isles through the volunteer and financial contributions of members of our community. These individuals, families, churches and businesses annually contribute an estimated 8,000 hours of service to those in need by providing shelter, clothes, food, and pastoral care.

The <u>Cancer Network Of Hope</u> provides support and encouragement for people who have cancer. FaithWorks can assist them with a utility bill, the cost of medicines, and transportation to doctor appointments and treatments. Cancer Network staff and volunteers visit patients, offer prayer shawls, Lydia totes and other helpful items to those who battle cancer.

<u>Open Doors</u> is a unique re-entry program designed to help people released from prison find work and become productive members of the community. We offer group mentoring, assistance with resume development and job searches, financial support, and transportation to job interviews. Open Doors works in cooperation and partnership with local agencies such as the Day Reporting Center of the Glynn County Drug Court.

The <u>Samaria Initiative</u> provides opportunities for neighbors from all walks within our community to come together to offer ministry to the elderly and others in need of assistance. Samaria Initiatives include outreach programs for neighborhoods along Wolfe Street and Norwich Street and the Second Saturday Sandwich ministry where a group of dedicated volunteers deliver food to elderly and disabled residents in some of Brunswick's poorest neighborhoods.









### Our Ministries

<u>Sparrow's Nest</u> provides food and financial assistance for people who are experiencing an emergency impacting their income or cash flow. Sparrow's Nest represents a collaborative of 30 local churches that provide assistance for families in need.

Sparrow's NEST

<u>The Well</u> is a hospitality and resource center for people who are homeless, providing resources such as a shower, a laundry room, phone, internet access, and an address for correspondence. FaithWorks assists guests with case management services, helping them access resources such as Gateway, Coastal Medical Access Program, Community Health Services, GA Department of Labor, Brunswick Housing and Veterans Administration.



<u>Pastoral Care</u>: FaithWorks has contracted with Southeast Georgia Health System since 1997 to provide pastoral care chaplaincy to the Brunswick Campus. Our chaplains visit patients and their families as well as work with staff, nurses, and physicians.

While we visit with anyone who requests a visit or who is referred to us, we focus primarily on those who are in crisis and/or who do not have a pastor of their own. We provide a chaplain on site for at least 40 hours per week and are on call 24/7 for emergency situations.

<u>Social and Case Management Services</u>: Many in our community suffer with chronic illness which can isolate them from others. Through its social services and case management work, FaithWorks reconnects people with essential public services, helping them to access health care safety net programs and secure themselves in life. For instance, when homeless male patients are discharged from Southeast Georgia Health System, they are often too ill to return to the street or to the Salvation Army shelter. FaithWorks provides these patients a homelike atmosphere where they can recuperate for a few more days.

<u>Volunteer Services:</u> FaithWorks serves the needs of more than 20,000 people annually in the Golden Isles through volunteer contributions from members of our community. We host more than 40 mission teams throughout the year to address many of the needs of our community.

FaithWorks encourages people to live out their faith. That might be as simple as taking a dinner to someone who

lives across the street. It might be as complicated as developing a whole ministry around a particular need in our community.

We might be holding a hand while someone is dying, or praying before someone goes into surgery or listening to someone in crisis. We might be picking up a piece of litter, hammering a nail or painting a wall. We might be planting a seed, mentoring a child or driving someone to the doctor. FaithWorks can be different things to different people... an opportunity...an angel in time of need...a resource. We offer hope, encouragement, love and support to all of God's children.





# 2016 Accomplishments

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." (Matthew 25:35-36 NIV)

### Feeding the Hungry

- ➤ Provided 3,672 families much-needed provisions from the Sparrow's Nest food pantry. The Sparrow's Nest also provided \$52,860 to assist with emergency support to meet utility and medical bills.
- ➤ Distributed more than 106,314 food items collected by more than 172 churches, schools and businesses. These donated food items are valued at \$87,919.



### Serving the Homeless and Marginalized

- ➤ Placed 71 homeless guests of The Well in secure and safe apartments or rooms.
- ➤ Helped 157 people who were homeless secure identification cards or birth certificates a critical first step in receiving medical and psychiatric care, finding employment and applying for government assistance.
- ➤ Our case manager conducted 283 initial interviews and 376 follow-up meetings to connect guests of The Well with housing and employment opportunities, medical (physical and mental) care, medicines, food and clothing.
- ➤ FaithWorks staff and volunteers shared God's love through the Samaria Project, making over 1,300 home visits to those marginalized providing food, comfort and support.
- ➤ Provided more than \$14,000 in material aid such as rent support and home goods to families in crisis.

### FaithWorks helps homeless family find a home

A house in downtown Brunswick is undergoing a transformation and will soon help a homeless family have a place of its own.

About three years ago, the local non-denominational mission group FaithWorks was given a house on Reynolds Street by a generous do-nor. The gift had a condition — to let the occupant stay in the home until her death.

"An older woman and her son

"An older woman and her son lived in the home for almost 30 yean," said the Rev. Wright Cul-pepper, executive director of Faithworks. Both recently passed away, kewing it in need of cleaning, painting and minor repair."

Culpepper said the organization really had no plans for the home until last week.

"I was over at College Place Unit-ed Methodist Church and heard the

member who had fallen on tough times," Culpepper said. "We hadn't planned on using the home for any-thing, yet ... it had just become empty on July 1, but this family needed a place to live and it just fell into also."

The father of the family fell off of a ladder while working and broke both feet. The medical bills and being out of work were a heavy burden for the family who found themselves homeless and living in a tent at the Jekyll Island camperound.

"It old College Place that we had no clue what kind of condition the house was in." Culpeper said. "It was covered with 30 years of dust for sure, but with some cleaning and painting, it could be used to help his family." Culpepper sent out a menal to some of his team and to supporters of the ministry. Volunteers started

"The mother is working two jobs to keep this family afloat as much as possible," Culpepper said, "And the father is right there, helping as much as he can. It's really amaz-ing how this all came about. He is an excellent painter and is a great exception for action the bases in

an excellent painter and is a great resource for getting the home in order."

Culpepper said that a stream of people has been coming in and out of the house working over the last week but more volunteers are need-ed to complete the work and get the family moved in.

### **Comforting the Sick**

- Visited more than 9,000 people in the hospital, providing pastoral care, prayer and comfort.
- Staff and volunteers provided transportation services to help patients get to medical and treatment appointments in Brunswick, Savannah and Jacksonville. More than 257 trips were logged last year. Of these, 143 trips were provided to cancer patients and members of their families.
- ➤ Helped 62 individuals get eye exams and prescription eyeglasses working with the Lions Club's charitable program and in partnership with American Vision.

Each year for his birthday, locals gather at Bubba Garcia's and toast to "Peace, Love and FaithWorks."








