## FEEDING THE HUNGRY





4,200 families served this year at **The Sparrow's Nest** including 399 new families.





114,418 donated food and toiletry items valued at \$111,628. Supporters like you conducted 40 local food drives to distribute 95,124 pounds of food.



• \$74,428 in financial assistance provided to 473 families through the **Sparrow's Nest Fund** which included \$27,350 in COVID-19 related support to 117 families.

### SERVING THE HOMELESS AND MARGINALIZED



homeless men and women hosted every day at **The Well**, which is open 365 days a 85 year. Guests at **The Well** are assisted with housing opportunities, access to medical (physical and mental) care, medicine, food, laundry and showers. Case managers assisted 130 new guests and conducted 246 follow up meetings.



72 people who were homeless received assistance to obtain a government-issued ID.



= \$5,113 in emergency medical assistance provided.



people who were once homeless were helped to prepare for job interviews.



winter nights were below 36 degrees in 2020. An average of 29 guests were sheltered from the cold each of those nights in the winter night shelter.



Two new properties were acquired on Reynolds Street and Goodyear Avenue for housing and employment readiness.
