3,892

families helped by **Sparrow's Nest**, providing 33,016 meals. 52 volunteers served 5,259 hours distributing 153,682 donated food and personal hygiene items.



158,622

pounds of food valued at \$150,706, including 707 turkeys and hams donated during Christmas and Thanksgiving.



\$83,311

in financial assistance provided to 386 families through the **Sparrow's Nest Fund** including \$49,513 in COVID-19 support to 184 families.

men and women hosted every day at **The Well** on average. Open 365 days, guests at The Well received \$2,781 in emergency care. Each month guests took 685 showers and did 400 loads of laundry.

new guests registered and helped by case managers at **The Well** with social services. More than 452 follow-up meetings conducted helping guests find homes, jobs, and secure benefits. Helped get 91 birth certificates and government IDs.


